The hospital is equipped with world-class medical and surgical care facilities to cater the health needs of animal patients. S. In the Pashu Palan Mela, GADVASU started a year-long 'Buffalo Promotion Mission-2019'. Dr. A S Nanda, Vice-Chancellor initiated this mission in the presence of farmers. Buffalo being the native animal, is well adapted to the local climatic conditions and resistant to various diseases and parasites. GADVASU has decided to dedicate full one year to create awareness and promoting of buffaloes, through regional research centre of GADVASU focusing on buffalo production system and profitability from buffalo rearing to boost the farmers' income. Dr. Nanda added that buffalo farmers will be given training on farm management and reproductive issues. GADVASU will also focus on special training on heifer nursery to the farmers on Punjab. ### Training under ‘Farmers First’ project

Along with general issues regarding fish farming specialized lectures were delivered on "Azolla culture and its use as fish feed and pond manure" and "Diversification of carp culture with Pangas".

Off campus monthly meeting of IFFA was held on Jan 17, 2019 at fish-cum-pig farm at Village Dolon Kalan (Ludhiana). Expert lecture and discussion session was held on scientific fish cum pig farming practices. Further, farmers were provided with tips related to winter care of fish.
